ONE OPERATIC ROLE AND TWO PROGRAMS OF VOCAL MUSIC

One operatic role and two vocal recitals were performed in lieu of a written dissertation.

The repertoire was chosen to reflect an advanced level of vocal study in all areas: technique, musicality, ensemble, and languages. The operatic role, Zerbinetta in *Ariadne auf Naxos* (Richard Strauss), is a hallmark role for coloratura soprano and requires advanced vocal skill and artistry. The first recital was an exploration of Romance languages and dialects that are non-standard in the vocal art song realm: Occitan, Catalan, Gallego, Portuguese, and Brazilian Portuguese. It also featured an ensemble collaboration requiring eight cellists. The second and final recital focused on European art song in the first half of the twentieth century. It contained works that are not often performed, and that expand the skills already acquired through study of the standard vocal art song repertoire of the 19th century.
