### **SOLINET Receives NEH Grant for Its Preservation Field Services Program**

The National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) awarded \$500,000 to SOLINET to support its regional Preservation Field Services program for libraries, archives, and museums. The grant will fund education and training, reference services, consulting, and provision of free information resources

to strengthen programs to preserve and protect collections in cultural organizations.

Plans and programs that support preservation are critical to enable access to collections and information resources now and in the future. The 2005 *Heritage Health Index Report* from Heritage Preservation reports that 77% of collecting institutions do not specifically allocate funds for preservation in their budgets, and that only 20% have paid staff dedicated to preservation. Furthermore, 80% do not have a written emergency response plan with staff trained to implement it.

Collections in all formats are in need of focused and ongoing preservation attention, and many continue to be damaged because of storage in poorly controlled environments or inadequate facilities. With the grant from NEH, SOLINET plans to increase preservation knowledge and skills in cultural organizations, provide support for effective preservation planning and management, and strengthen the regional preservation community.

The Preservation Field Services Program at SOLINET has provided leadership, collaboration, and educational services since 1984, with many activities funded during that time by other grants from NEH. During this new grant, SOLINET will continue its successful preservation education and training program, focusing on the development of more web-based courses and a new online curriculum devoted to preservation of digital resources. New interactive, web-based resources will be developed and freely provided to promote preservation best practices and enable ready access to

reliable information. The NEH grant also supports the continuation of disaster response and recovery services, including 24/7 telephone and e-mail assistance, on-site assistance from volunteer experts, and emergency communication support through a disaster wiki. The award from NEH funds services from 2008 through 2010.

### **Louisiana Honors SOLINET for Hurricane Recovery Assistance**

Louisiana State Librarian Rebecca Hamilton presented a certificate of proclamation to SOLINET for “shining the light on Louisiana.” This proclamation was signed by Mitch Landrieu, the lieutenant governor of Louisiana.

“It is a real privilege for SOLINET to work with the libraries on the Gulf Coast,” said Kate Nevins, SOLINET Executive Director. “These libraries have been so strong during a difficult time and have not only continued to provide vital services to their patrons, they have expanded their offerings to meet increased needs.”

The proclamation honors SOLINET for its support of libraries in hurricane-affected areas. With the assistance of a \$12.2 million grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, SOLINET and the State Library of Louisiana are supporting public libraries in the state recover from Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. The three-year grant has funded temporary branches, library staff positions, operating expenses, collection development, the planning process for new library facilities, and computers with Internet access.

### **SOLINET to Co-Sponsor Web 2.0 Conference**

“Changing the Way Libraries Do Business: Meeting the Challenges of a Web 2.0 World” will be Thursday, March 20, at Arlington County Public Library in Virginia. The daylong conference will offer these sessions:

- **Keynote: Emerging Trends and Tools that Make Your Online Life Easier** by Jenny Levine, Internet Development Specialist and Strategy Guide at ALA.
- **Playing to Learn in the Summer of '07: How 23 Things Opened the Door to Web 2.0 for Maryland Public Library Staff** by Jennifer Howell, Staff Development Coordinator at Western Maryland Regional Library.
- **JMO, HTH! Social Networking in Academic Libraries** by Jamie W. Coniglio, Head of the Reference Department at Fenwick Library at George Mason University in Virginia.
- **Metadata Before and After the Web (2.0)** by Karen Calhoun, Vice President of WorldCat and Metadata Services at OCLC.
- **LibraryThing for Libraries** by Kate Sheehan, incoming Head of Knowledge and Innovation Services at Darien Library in Connecticut.

The cost is \$85 for members of SOLINET or OCLC Eastern, and \$110 for non-members of either organization.
